She runs courses on 'Psychosocial Issues in Palliative Care' and 'Ethics, Culture and Societal Approaches to Death' and also works as a social worker at Hospice West Auckland. Her research is in the field of palliative care social work, currently focusing on the experiences of GPs and primary healthcare providers in delivering palliative care to strengthen the workforce and enhance service delivery. She is also part of the Te Arai Palliative Care research group consulting on the palliative care needs for refugee communities.

- facilitating difficult conversations
- providing holistic, compassionate care in end-of-life scenarios
