We are looking for an experienced nurse that wants to be part of our Community Palliative Care (CPC) team. In this role you will deliver high quality, specialist & holistic nursing care to patients and families/whanau. You will also provide support and education to other members of a patient's health care team including practice nurses, district nurses and aged residential care facilities. We are looking for applicants who are interested in joining us and working in a values based clinical environment.

The successful applicant will have:
