Tōtara Hospice www.hospice.co.nz has just entered a new phase – we call it Generation 3. We have an integrated care management style that follows and supports the patient's journey at all points, and is underpinned by a *Te Whare Tapa Whā* approach (a holistic Māori health model) where the team collaborates in partnership with the patient and their whānau, applying clear care pathways or programmes to each episode of care. Our multidisciplinary staff work across all professions, and roles are exposed to the entire service continuum.

The team is small (~100 staff) and close knit, working at the top of their scopes of practice across each role. A contemporary and agile organisation, we swiftly adapted to cope with the COVID-19 situation, ensuring uninterrupted inpatient and community services, and maintaining our commitment to never let anyone die alone.

As an employer, we are proud of the inclusive environment we have built. - Provide on-call duty service after hours
- Provide clinical cross cover for the Hospital Palliative Care Team (HPCT) of Middlemore Hospital when required
- Contribute where appropriate to Hospice clinical, educational & research activities
- Actively participate in the strategic direction of the organization and the smooth running of the medical team

You will have excellent clinical knowledge and a practice base in Palliative Medicine.

The successful candidate must have:

- Specialist qualification in Palliative Medicine, recognised by the RACP (Royal Australasian College of Physicians) and the MCNZ (Medical Council of New Zealand)
- Experience working within a multi-disciplinary team
- Excellent English language communication skills – both verbal and written
- Experience in both hospital and hospice settings would be an added advantage
- Minimum 2 years' post-specialist qualification in a credentialed palliative care institution would be useful, but we have some flexibility for the right candidate.
