Hospices are positioned to meet the needs of communities and are developing services that are fit for the future.



76% of patients were aged 65 and over.

10,880 people who died this year were cared for by hospice.

68% of patients had a Cancer diagnosis
31% had a Chronic disease diagnosis including 2% with a Dementia diagnosis.

Equity and Sustainability Pathway

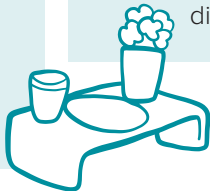
A group of mandated hospice representatives helping hospices prepare for changes to commissioning and the opportunities it presents.

Our Kaiwhakahaere went on a national tour around the motu to support the implementation of **Mauri Mate: A Māori Palliative Care Framework for Hospices.**



13% of hospice patients identified as Māori.

18,582 patients plus their whānau were cared for by hospice.



166,146 face to face contacts.

45% of hospice patients died at home.

On Facebook, Latoya's video received nearly **300,000** impressions and a click through of **59%**.



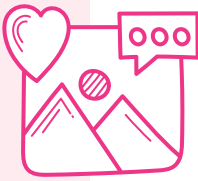
During May, media stories on the value of hospice care reached over 2 million New Zealanders.

Our FaceBook Reach increased **170%** to over **360,000.**

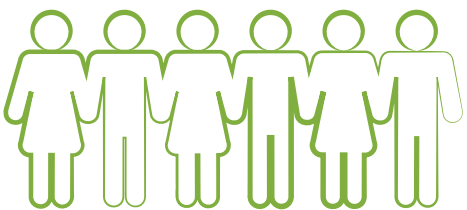


We secured seven separate face to face meetings with either **Ministers** or **Opposition Leaders** holding the health portfolio.

9 BNI scholarships to allied health staff (valued at \$12,000)

\$319,052 was raised for local hospices by **BNI New Zealand Chapters**



Dilmah donated **400,000** Tea bags to hospices at a value of **\$50,000.**



\$905,942 was raised nationally in the **Farmers Christmas Campaign.**



The Hospice New Zealand Grants Programme, supported by the **Harcourts Foundation** gave out **\$50,000** in grants, benefiting 11 hospices.

1,295 learners have registered for the **syringe driver online training** offered in partnership with Hospice Waikato.



Every month, more than **300** healthcare staff across Aotearoa watch our **Palliative Care Lecture** via webinar, in partnership with Mobile Health.

1,144 learners have registered with the **Knowledge Hub** in the last 12 months.



741 donations, totalling over **\$225,000** were made to hospices via the Hospice NZ website donations page.
